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Message From the Principal

Greetings Terrebonne Community and Families,

I hope you were able to take advantage of the great weather and do something fun with the family over spring break...I know my family and I did. It feels utterly strange to write a message to you with the month of April attached to it as it signifies both the start of spring and that our year is moving entirely too fast. When I was a kid the years always seemed to go by so slowly, but now that I am an adult they seem to be on fast-forward!

As the month of April begins I'd like to keep you apprised of some key events that are coming down the pike:

- ◆ Parent teacher conferences were well attended this spring. While conferencing two times per year to discuss your child and their progress here at school are never enough, I do believe these are valuable times to make a personal connection and get some quality feedback. I would always encourage you to foster the home to school relationship (as I do with my staff) and contact teachers more often. They love to hear from you and have a strong desire to develop a true partnership with you and your child.
- ◆ We were unable to find a suitable track and field coach for our season so unfortunately this means we will not have a team this year for our middle school students. If your child is interested in participating in track and field they do have an opportunity to participate on the team at Elton Gregory. Please contact the school to find out how to make this happen.
- ◆ State testing began before spring break, with our 5th and 8th grade students taking the OAKS science assessment. 73% and 70% respectively were meeting or exceeding the standards in science based on this assessment. Middle school students will take the first three weeks of April to complete their Smarter Balanced Assessments, working on a typical multiple-choice test and a performance task in both math and reading. Students in grades 3-5 will begin testing with the same format on April 20.
- ◆ We hope to plan a Family Night in late April or early May...stay tuned for details on this.
- ◆ We are seeking highly motivated volunteers to reestablish our PTO for the 2015-16 school year. If you are interested in being part of a small, but mighty group of people who are dedicated to supporting Terrebonne students through partnering with our staff and community, please contact me to discuss this opportunity.

Terrebonne Community School will be holding its official Kindergarten Roundup on Tuesday, April 7th, from 10:00am to 6:00pm. You may come and enroll your 5-year-old for our 2015-16 Fall kindergarten classes. Please bring with you your child's Birth Certificate, Immunization Records, and your Proof of Residence. Children must be 5 years old by September 1, 2015.

On this day, we will have representatives from our Terrebonne Boys & Girls Club who can give you information on our Terrebonne Club. Our F.A.N. (Family Access Network) Coordinator will be available to offer any resource information you may need, and our School Nurse will be available to discuss any questions regarding immunizations for school. An Interpreter will also be available, if needed.

If you can not make it on this date, you can stop by the school office on any day after that date and pick up an enrollment packet for your child.



Another Volunteer Opportunity through Volunteer Connect: **Steelhead Falls Restoration**

Friends and Neighbors (FANs) of Deschutes Canyon volunteers, in cooperation with the BLM, have been working to remove invasive weeds and plant native seeds and plants along the Steelhead Falls trail. Over 160 hours have been donated to the project so far, but we need more help. On April 18, our final day of restoration, volunteers will be planting wildflowers near the trailhead, weeding around the parking lot and cleaning up the BLM campground.

Be prepared to work in outdoor conditions with variable weather. Long pants are preferred. Bring work gloves and a trowel if you have them.

Project takes place from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. with celebration and refreshments to follow.

Minimum age requirement: None, volunteers under 15 must be accompanied by an adult.
